This is the annual activity report of the Ethnicity, Nationalism, and Migration Section of the International Studies Association (ENMISA) and summarizes the activities to date for the year of 2011.

• **Annual Conference Program Contributions:**

The ENMISA section of the 2011 annual conference program was organized by co-program chairs Victor Asal and Matteo Fumagalli; ENMISA successfully stretched its original panel quota with numerous co-sponsorships. Victor and Matteo co-chaired the 2012 section conference program as well, with a similar outcome. The initial ENMISA quota of 38 panels was extended by 32% to 50 panels through co-sponsorships with other sections.

• **Martin O. Heisler Graduate Student Paper Award:**

ENMISA annually gives an award to the best paper written and presented by a graduate student at the previous ISA annual conference. The 2011 committee included Stephen Deets(Chair), Mike Lebson, and Peter Trumbore and recognized Cetta Mainwaring for her paper "Transforming Interests on the EU's Southern Periphery: Malta and Migration Policy." She received a \$300 check, certificate, and a one-year ENMISA membership.

• **ENMISA Book Award:**

Starting in 2009, ENMISA began presenting an award for the best book published in the previous two years on topics related to the section's fields of expertise. The 2011 book award committee was composed of Willem Maas (Chair), Neophytos Loizides, and Ana Margheritis; the committee recognized Natasha Iskander, *Creative State: Forty Years of Migration and Development Policy in Morocco and Mexico* (Cornell University Press) and Kim Rygiel, *Globalizing Citizenship* (University of British Columbia Press) as co-winners of the ENMISA Book Award for 2011. The 2011-2012 ENMISA Book Award Committee included Anna Margheritis (Chair), Dejan Guzina, and Kim Rygiel.

• **ENMISA Distinguished Scholar Award:**

ENMISA annually recognizes a scholar who has achieved high distinction in scholarship and service to the field with its Distinguished Scholar Award. The 2011 committee was composed of Neophytos Loizides (Chair), Kamal Sadiq, and Peter Trumbore, and they recognized Walker Connor as the

2011 ENMISA Distinguished Scholar. The 2011-2012 ENMISA Distinguished Scholar Committee was composed of Omar McDoom (Chair), Josephine Squires, and Neophytos Loizides.

• **Reception at the Annual Conference:**

For several years, ENMISA has co-sponsored a reception at the Annual Conference. The 2011 reception at Montreal was co-sponsored with Human Rights and Peace Studies sections and Lynne Rienner Publishers, Routledge, Oxford University Press, and Johns Hopkins University Press).

• **Elections:**

ENMISA elected a new slate of officers in 2011, as well as a couple of at-large board members (see below for current executive committee membership). Stephen Saideman, then at McGill University, chaired the nomination & elections process.

• **ENMISA Budget**

The budget for the section is in positive growth. The balance for the section on January 1, 2011 was \$4,816.21 and the balance at the end of the year (December 31, 2011) was \$5,225.46. This means an addition of \$409.25 to the section budget over the course of 2011. The breakdown was as follows: total 2011 income was \$4,530, and expenditures (almost all going toward events and awards at the annual meeting in Montreal) totaled \$4120.75.

In general, ENMISA spends money on the same things every year—co-sponsorship of the reception, a graduate student paper award, plaques for the book and distinguished scholar awards, and breakfast for the section offers at an annual breakfast meeting ahead of the business meeting. These expenses have historically been covered by our dues revenue, and should continue to be for the foreseeable future.

In the past year, ENMISA has spent money on the following items (expenditures are rough estimates based partly on previous years):

• Co-sponsorship of reception at annual conference:	\$600
• Certificate for Heisler Award Winner:	\$35
• Check for Heisler Award Winner:	\$300
• Plaques for Book Award Winners:	\$170
• Plaque for Distinguished Scholar Winner:	\$ 85
• Breakfast for Executive Committee at annual conference:	\$150
